1. Welcome

Remote Teams meeting opened by Joint Chairs and attendees welcomed.

2. Partnership Update

Ongoing engagement and opportunities outlined with a focus on engagement with key partners including Severn Trent (ST), National Farmers Union (NFU) and Homes England noted.

ACTION

Homes England Market Places and Partners Team have local leads. Local Authority partners to raise River Severn Partnership with their local leads and to see whether a Homes England representative can join the partnership going forward.

ACTION

Parliamentary interest was reviewed and includes a current request from Minister Pow for an update on the River Severn Partnership and progress. An action was taken for partners to be briefed on the proposed timeline for any MP engagement ahead of bringing together the MP Consortium.

Ongoing engagement with Cabinet Office was outlined, aimed at raising the profile of the River Severn Partnership with the intention of securing the Programme as a named National Project.

3. Partnership Governance and Processes

AGREEMENT

Partners agreed governance arrangements.

ACTION

Partners to work with Hayley and complete any outstanding gaps in the governance with named individuals.

ACTION

A query was raised about cross border representation on the Partnership from Powys Council and the Grow Mid Wales Partnership. Gill Hamer agreed an action to raise with her counterparts in the Grow Mid Wales Partnership as part of an upcoming cross border meeting with the Marches LEP.

AGREEMENT

Partners supported Shropshire Council as Accountable Body for the Partnership.

AGREEMENT

Partners agreed the Terms of Reference for the MP Consortium

AGREEMENT

Partners agreed the Partnership MOU

4. Building the Programme

Future work to support the programme was outlined and includes place based workshop sessions to be run remotely along with the use of partner funds to commission work, as set out in Paper 2.

ACTION

Gloucestershire and Worcestershire leads to work with Hayley to agree workshop sessions and dates to run these between now and the end of July.

ACTION

Suggestion that LNP representatives be invited to join the Board was noted and an action taken to pursue with LNPs.

ACTION

Initial work programme in Paper 2 was discussed and agreed. It includes establishment of a virtual programme team. Partners to provide Hayley with lead contacts from economy, growth and environment teams within each geography to form this virtual programme team.

5. Investment Narrative

ACTION

Partners supported the Draft investment document produced as an engagement tool to provide a common narrative. Document to evolve as the partnership develops but all agreed that the current draft is a good basis for use as necessary. Mark Barrow highlighted work that is ongoing via Shropshire Council around branding and agreed an action to share draft logos in due course for comment.

ACTION

MACE provided a presentation on the support they are offering the partnership in terms of benefit assessment, particularly focused on building an economic model which will help to identify and quantify the economic benefits. Hayley to share MACE presentation slides. MACE to consider building in Covid recovery as a key theme in the economic model.

ACTION

Partners queried how the economic dimensions of the partnership sit within the current draft governance. It was agreed that the current place based groups should be supported by theme based groups. Hayley to review and update governance with thematic groups. Partners to consider themes and send to Hayley.

6. Innovation and Funding

6a. 5G Funding Opportunity

An innovative funding opportunity linked to the development of 5G networks was outlined.

The funding competition closes on 27 July. Initial ideas are being explored around links to the River Severn Partnership, including using 5G to assist with water management scenario testing across the catchment and use of 5G to deliver responsive abstraction lisencing for Agri- Tech sector.

ACTION

Partners to provide Hayley with ideas to support the development of a bid.

6b. Green Tourism Opportunities

Green / environmental tourism opportunities were outlined and discussed including discussions with Eden International and ongoing work linked to joint working between Shropshire and Wyre Forest.

ACTION

Partners expressed interest in exploring the role of the river as a tourism asset to support the visitor economy.

7. AOB

Hayley outlined the request she has received from national EA colleagues to share the River Severn Partnership as a live case study. This will be on a cross government sharepoint linked to innovative work around delivery of the 25 year Environment Plan.

The Comprehensive Spending Review in October/November was highlighted as a key milestone that the Partnership should work towards.

ACTION

An action was taken to explore how Midlands Connect secure schemes as named National Projects in order to secure support and funding.

It was agreed that the next meeting needs to take place before the planned next quarterly (Aug 2020) session, in light of the CSR timescale. Hayley to confirm dates.
